I. POLICY: The Annual Security and Fire Safety reports for NYU's degree-granting campuses contain information and crime statistics for the three previous calendar years regarding crimes that occurred on campus, in certain off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by NYU, and on public property within, or immediately adjacent to and accessible to the campuses. The reports also contain information regarding campus security and personal safety topics such as crime prevention, fire safety, crime reporting policies, prevention and awareness programs, services for victims, disciplinary procedures, and other information related to the safety and security of the NYU community.

II. PURPOSE: The safety of our students, faculty, staff and visitors is of paramount importance to New York University and the NYU Long Island School of Medicine. Under the U.S. federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act, colleges and universities participating in federal student aid programs are required to collect and report statistics about certain criminal offenses that occurred in specified locations which have been reported to a local police agency or any official of the institution who has significant responsibility for student and campus activities.
